

Electric Vehicle and Charging Points Survey FAQ

Q: What will happen to my survey responses?

A: We will use the feedback to help develop more electric vehicle charging infrastructure in the Combined Authority area. We will ensure that the views we receive are taken into consideration.

Q: Why have a survey now?

A: We would like to hear views from the public as we plan for the transition to electric vehicles. Hearing public opinions at an early stage will inform how those plans develop.

Q: When will the Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Strategy be ready? What will it do?

A: A draft of the strategy is located [here](#). We are aiming for the Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Strategy to be approved in spring 2024.

Q: I don't want an electric vehicle/I don't have access to a car, can I take the survey?

A Yes, your opinion matters. We are asking questions like where you think electric charging points could be placed, such as within residential areas, shopping areas, and community facilities like villages halls and libraries. Anyone could have a view on this.

Q: What is the Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Combined Authority (CPCA?)

A: On 3 March 2017, Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Combined Authority was established as a Mayoral Combined Authority for the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough area. The mission of the Combined Authority is to make life better, healthier, and fairer for all. The Combined Authority works with our local councils, the Business Board (Local Enterprise Partnership), local public services, Government departments and agencies, universities and businesses to grow the local and national economy.

Q: And what is its role?

A: The Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority (CPCA) is a local government authority responsible for growing the economy, improving skills and job prospects, overseeing public transport, enhancing digital connectivity, building housing, and addressing climate change in the region.
