Item 1: Welcome, Apologies & Declarations of Interests

Apologies received from Dr Belinda Clarke (Agri-Tech East),

There were two conflicts of interest: Dr Smith concerning the application from InsPro Ltd and Cllr Shuter concerning the application from Chilford Hundred Ltd. It was agreed that Mike Burrows should chair the session with InsPro Ltd, as New Anglia LEP are partners with the Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Combined Authority in delivering the Eastern Agri-Tech Growth Initiative.

Item 2: Applications For Grant Support

There were four applications for grant funding. The Eastern Agri-Tech Programme Board considered and approved three applications and rejected one application. This followed applications and presentations from each applicant and discussions with the Eastern Agri-Tech Programme Board.

In the order they appeared on the Agenda, the successful applicants were Howseman Agrisupplies Ltd; InsPro Ltd and Chilford Hundred Ltd. The application from JD Cooling Systems Ltd was unsuccessful.

Howseman Agrisupplies Ltd was awarded a growth grant of £33,000 towards the cost of developing/purchasing drip irrigation equipment. The Board liked the proposal and the technology.

InsPro Ltd was awarded an R&D grant of £48,599 towards the cost of proving the worth of a new bioconversion unit for black soldier fly (BSF) cultivation. The Board felt this technology could make a difference in the recycling of food waste.

Chilford Hundred Ltd was awarded a Growth grant of £53,000 towards the purchase costs of additional wine making equipment to expand their wine production capacity.

JD Cooling Systems Ltd's R&D application was to validate their Softripe technology for (stone) fruits relevant to the UK market. The Board had several key concerns, the major one being that the unit belonged to a German company; the Programme Board felt that the German company should be responsible for any validation of their own technology and not UK taxpayers.
