I write with reference to your request received on 20 September 2018 reference CA20. Please find the response below.

Q1. What are your authority's policy priorities for local rail transport? Do you support rail as a key transport element?

The combined Authority, under its statutory obligation as the Transport Authority is currently developing a new Local Transport plan which will set out the Authority's transport objectives and priorities. This will consider the infrastructure demand across a number of modes and identify infrastructure opportunities in rail and road solutions. Consultation on this document will happen early in 2019. Until the publication of the new transport plan, the Interim transport plan that has been published covers current priorities and opportunities. The document can be found at:

This does though represent more in the way of developing priorities than policies and these are generally what are referred to below.

Q2. Has your authority adopted a policy to support or advocate the reinstatement of any passenger rail services falling within the categories shown below? If you have route mileages, cost estimates or Benefit Cost Ratios (BCRs) for any such rail routes please provide information/links to any such policy documents.

Under C below we are currently assessing and developing business cases to understand opportunities to reinstate the disused Wisbech to March rail line.

- (a) Express service (fast, high speed, long distance, Inter City, Eurostar etc.)
- **(b) Regional service** (semi-fast, limited stop, inter-urban, commuter etc.)
- (c) Local service (stopping, commuter etc.)
- (d) Metro (suburban, stopping, commuter, overground etc.)
- (e) Subway/Underground/Tube (urban, stopping, part underground)
- (f) Light Rail/Tram/Tramtrains etc (urban, stopping, bus equivalent)

- (g) Heritage/tourist (steam, diesel, electric please state if narrow not standard gauge)
- **(h)** Other (please provide further information).
- Q3. Has your authority adopted a policy to support or advocate the reinstatement of any local freight rail services falling within the categories shown below? If you have route mileages, cost estimates or Benefit Cost Ratios (BCRs) for any such rail routes please provide information/links to any such policy documents. No
  - (a) Intermodal (container) freight (e.g. freightliner shipping containers, waste trains)

Soham Rail station – we currently considering a new station on an existing line that passes through Soham. A Business Case for this document will come forward end of 2018 as part of CPCA review process into the opportunity.

Ongoing reviews of the Wisbech to March rail line to identify if there is a requirement for new stations.

Feasibility and business case studies are ongoing. Funding allocation for delivery will be decided on the completion of this process.

  - Fenland Stations regeneration = all stations existing
- (h) Please indicate whether each project will use pre-existing infrastructure; Wisbech to March will use existing disused route. Fenland Stations Regeneration is exisiting stations being refurbished / improved.
- (i) If so, please provide further details
- Q8. Do you have or have you had access to other funds from Government, EU, public or private funds? If so, which? (e.g. LEP funding, EU development funds, the UK Coastal Communities Fund, where relevant)

The combined Authority has access to all pertinent funds for delivering public Sector infrastructure project. Individual funding and financing strategies will be developed as part of the business case development for each project.
