Re: Freedom of Information request ref CA293

Thank you for your request for information received on 12 February 2024. The response is given below:

Request

I am requesting information about the bus fleet across the mayoral authority. We define the bus fleet as buses owned by the combined/mayoral authority or relevant transport body and those owned by private operators. This information may be held by a relevant transport body.

In particular, please supply me with information relating to the following questions:

- a) What is the percentage of the bus fleet across the mayoral authority that is zero emission? Please could the total percentage be given as well as the percentage of the bus fleet that are hydrogen buses and battery electric buses.
- b) What is the total number of zero emission buses within the mayoral authority? Please could the number be given for hydrogen buses and battery electric buses.
- c) What is the total number of buses in the bus fleet?

We define zero emission buses as buses that are run on hydrogen or battery electric. We do not include hybrid buses or biodiesel buses as zero emission.

Response

Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority does not own or part-own any buses – all are privately owned.

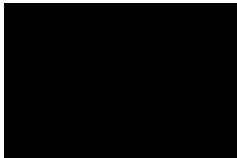
- a) There are 43 battery electric buses and 0 hydrogen buses in the fleet. We have a joint-bid in for a further 33 battery electric buses, the outcome of the bid is due in March.
- b) As above. 43 buses out of 340 = 12.6%
- c) Size of total fleet is not easily defined. We define this as service buses and spare vehicles, not coaches or dedicated school buses, that are garaged within the Authority area over night - which gives around 340 buses in total.
