Section 40 exemption

Section 40 of the Act provides that:

40.— Personal information

(1) Any information to which a request for information relates is exempt information if it constitutes personal data of which the applicant is the data subject.

The Information Commissioner's guidance on the requests for personal data about public authority employees is available on the ICO website. The guidance confirms that it covers data which can identify individual employees.

The above exemption IS *absolute*. This means that there is no public interest test to consider when applying the exemption.
