Background Information	On 27 June 2018, the CA Board were asked to approve the St Neots Market Towns Masterplan and several direct investments in St Neots of which the St Neots Great Ouse Northern Crossing Cycle bridge was one. The CA Board agreed a contribution of £3.1m (£2.5m for the construction of the bridge and £600,000 for the footway improvements to the riverside area) to support the construction of a new foot and cycle bridge in St Neots town centre, alongside improvements to the riverside area.			
	On 29 April 2020, a paper was taken to CA Board to summarise work to date on the St Neots Foot and Cycle Bridge and Regatta Meadows, confirmed that the projected construction costs for the project exceeded the allocated budget and sought the agreement of the CA Board that the scheme should not proceed as it no longer met the requirements for Value for Money set out in the Combined Authority's Assurance Framework. The CA Board agreed that the £3.1m CPCA funding allocated to that project be re-allocated to projects to support delivery of the St Neots Masterplan, and to recycle the market town investment back into St Neots through the Investment Prospectus process.			
	Securing £3.1m of grant funding from the CPCA Market Towns Programme as match to FHSF bid will help to leverage in over £9m of funding from other sources, primarily the Ministry of Housing, Communities & Local Government (MHCLG).			
	The CPCA funding will play an integral role in helping the FHSF Programme deliver core elements of the St Neots Masterplan for Growth. Proposals were developed through collaboration with the Masterplan Steering Group, including working group sub-groups, to design solutions that best complement the town's short/medium/long term aspirations. Enhanced urban realm and a more attractive town centre will create a solid foundation for future delivery of further Masterplan objectives. Proposals were also developed through collaboration with the Cambridgeshire County Council St Neots Town Centre Transport Study, meaning proposals complement long term local transport ambitions.			
	The funding application was received on 7 <sup>th</sup> July and has been assessed internally by CPCA officers and evaluated by members

	of the EAP (Entrepreneurial Assessment Panel) and the Business Board. The resulting consensus has awarded an overall score of 89.7 (out of 99 and pass mark of 74) and the project proposal is recommended for approval.				
	The application has been through the programme criteria and governance process however requesting approval at CA Board on 5 <sup>th</sup> August 2020 is not possible as this falls outside the MHCLG submission date of 31 <sup>st</sup> July 2020. A decision on the application is required immediately to allow an offer letter to be issued to Huntingdonshire District Council confirming approval of £3.1m CPCA funding as match funding to the FHSF bid for St Neots.

	To agree to the funding in principle, subject to the application being approved at CA Board on 5 August 2020. This would delay the confirmation of match funding ahead of FHSF bid to MHCLG by 31 July 2020.

Please include budget codes for your directorate</li> <li>As set out above the CA Board approved a budget of £3.1m for the St Neots Great Ouse Northern Crossing Cycle bridge and, in response to project changes, withdrew this funding but ringfenced it for other projects within St Neots. There was no expenditure on the project budget prior to its cancellation so the £3.1m is available from a combination of the £600k unspent in 2019-20 and £2.5m in the current year St Neots Masterplan Capital approved budget.</li> </ul>
