Decision taken	Please provide an overview of the decision taken.		
	The Chief Executive agreed to appoint Cambridge Connect to undertake the following activities:		
	 a) Production of a Scheme Definition Report for the Light- Rail proposal. This will encompass: 		
	Setting out key elements of the proposed Cambridge Light- Rail scheme including routes, stops, tunnel requirements, technologies, interchanges, integration with other transport modes.		
	Acting as a more detailed conceptual plan that can be considered as part of the current Mass Rapid Transport feasibility report being undertaken by Steer Davies Gleave (SDG).		
	Form a 'base case' of the Light-Rail proposal which can then be developed further on completion of the SDG study.		
	b) To undertake a critical review of the Light-Rail elements of the current Mass Rapid Transport feasibility report being undertaken by SDG. This review will be undertaken via the Transport and Infrastructure Director rather than through direct engagement between Cambridge Connect and SDG.

	The Chief Executive is operating under authority delegated by the Combined Authority Board as set out in the Constitution. The		



	Chief Executive has authority to award contracts up to the value of £50,000 provided that any decision made by the Chief Executive is reported at the next Board meeting.
Background Information	<i>Give details of background information</i> Cambridge Connect is an independent, private sector consultancy aimed at creating an enduring system of rapid and sustainable transit that will help address the transport challenges facing Cambridge, while ensuring that the social and cultural qualities that define the City are maintained and enhanced.
	The Light-Rail proposal developed by Cambridge connect is strongly supported by the Mayor and is seen as a key component to delivering housing growth along transport corridors.
	The Combined Authority, in partnership with the Greater Cambridge Partnership, has procured an independent study looking at Mass Rapid Transport for Cambridge and the surrounding travel to work areas. This study is being undertaken by SDG and will conclude in November 2017.
	The additional study work proposed by Cambridge Connect is separate to this SDG study but provides an opportunity to provide the SDG report with a robust evidence base for Light-Rail. It is important to note that there are two key competing proposals – a bus based solution called Affordable Very Rapid Transport (AVRT) which is being promoted by GCP and the Light-Rail proposal being promoted by the Combined Authority. The AVRT proposal has already been funding by GCP and other bodies and could be considered to be further developed than the Light-Rail proposal. As a result, there are concerns that the lack parity in the development of these two proposals may adversely affect the consideration of the Light-Rail proposal. The additional Cambridge Connect work being requested is intended to provide greater parity between the two proposals.
