Background Information	The costs of the lease agreement has been based on the Mayor's remaining term of office which stands at 3 years. The property lease is in line to cease at the end of the mayoral elections in 2021.	
	The setting up of the office requires the purchase of additional furniture and IT equipment for the Mayor and his support staff.	
	Existing furniture and IT equipment is to be moved to the new offices and any furniture which is no longer fit for purpose is to be sold and any income received is offset against the cost of purchasing new office furniture.	
Alternative options considered.	Three options were offered as potential alternative solutions:	
	1) To remain in the current accommodation at East Cambs District Council	
	2) To reside at Combined Authority Offices in Alconbury3) To look for accommodation in the Ely area.	
	The first two options were ruled out at for the following reasons:	
	The accommodation occupied at East Cambs District Council was originally a temporary solution whilst the Combined Authority became established and with the merger with the LEP meant that organisation was going to grow and the accommodation would no longer be suitable.	
	The Mayor wished to remain in the Ely area and be accessible to both the business and local communities. The requirements for the accommodation requires a large meeting room, suitable for Board meetings and sufficient office space for his support team. The premises at 72 Market Street is on a main street within Ely and meets the criteria required.
